Greetings Neighbors,

As we near the end of 2011 in the Isle of Pines community. As the countdown continues for the beginning of 2012, we can be thankful for the many blessing bestowed on our community in spite of the troubling times that our country and world is going through.

The Isle of **Slash** Pines

When you moved into the Isle of Pines neighborhood you moved into what is called a slash pine flatwoods forest. There are no longleaf or loblolly pines here. These three types of pines look similar. One way to tell the difference is that slash pine needles come in bundles (fascicles) of 2's and 3's while longleaf and loblolly always have needles in bundles of 3's. All these pines are native to Florida.

Our neighborhood was once a turpentine camp. Laborers would "cat-face" trees by slashing V-shaped cuts into the trunk and adding tin strips that would guide the flow of sap into clay pots called Herty cups. You can still find cat-faced trees and Herty cups in our neighborhood. There is a tree in my yard that bears the scars, has the tin strips, the nails that held the cups, and broken pieces of the clay pot still lay at the base of the tree. Pine sap was collected then heated in turpentine stills. The vapors distilled off and cooled to become turpentine. The thick solid left behind was rosin and was used as naval stores to seal ships hulls, as a preservative coating on sails and ropes and in medicine like Vicks Vapor Rub.

Slash pines can grow to 100' and live up to 200 years. IOP residents didn't move out here for the sidewalks, street lights and nearby shopping. Actually many of us wanted away from all that. What we did want was the trees and the country atmosphere. So it strikes me as funny that some folks move 20 miles out of town to the IOP and then cut down all the pine trees on their lot. Even some people who want to save their trees end up killing them because they simply didn't know the right way to save them. Using heavy equipment to clear vegetation by scraping around the pines will surely kill them. Once a tree is weakened the pine beetles will finish it off and then may spread to a neighbor's trees. Be careful around your pine trees. We don't want the Isle of Pines Neighborhood to turn into Lone Pine Development.

Ingredients

2. Make the snowman by rolling two thirds of the cheese into a ball for his body and the other third into a ball for his head. Stack the balls, then add the facial features, clothing, arms, and pipe as shown. Serve with crackers or mini bagels.

Onsite Wastewater Treatment Systems Special Issues Fact Sheet 1

Septic Tank Additives

Description

Because of the presence of significant numbers and types of bacteria, enzymes, yeasts, and other fungi and microorganisms in typical residential and commercial wastewaters, the use of septic system additives containing these or any other ingredients is not recommended. The benefits of consumer products sold as septic system cleaners, degraders, decomposers, deodorizers, organic digesters, or enhancers are not significant or have not been demonstrated conclusively, depending on the product. Some of these products can actually interfere with treatment processes, affect biological decomposition of wastes, contribute to system clogging, and contaminate ground water. The septic tank/soil absorption field system is the most commonly used onsite wastewater treatment system in the United States. It is relatively low in cost, has no moving parts, and requires little maintenance.. Septic tanks have a number of important functions, including:

- Remove oils, grease and settleable solids. The septic tank is designed to provide quiescent conditions over a sufficient time period to allow settleable solids to sink to the bottom of the tank and floatable solids, oils, and grease to rise to the surface. The result is a middle layer of partially clarified effluent that exits the tank to the soil absorption field.
- *Store settleable and floatable material*. Tanks are generously sized according to projected wastewater flow and composition to accumulate sludge and scum at the bottom and top of the tank, respectively. Tanks require pumping at infrequent intervals (e.g., 1 to 7 years), depending on sludge and scum accumulation rates.
- *Digest/decompose organic matter*. In an anaerobic environment, facultative and anaerobic bacteria can reduce retained organic molecules to soluble compounds and gases, including H₂, CO₂, NH₃, H₂S, and CH₄. This digestion can significantly reduce sludge volume in warm climates.

Types of additives and effects on treatment processes

There are three general types of commonly marketed septic system additives:

- *Inorganic compounds, usually strong acids or alkalis,* are promoted for their ability to open clogged drains. Product ingredients (e.g., sulfuric acid, lye) are similar to those used in popular commercial drain cleaners. These products can adversely affect biological decomposition processes in the treatment system and cause structural damage to pipes, septic tanks, and other treatment system components. Hydrogen peroxide, once promoted as an infiltration field reconditioner, has been found to actually degrade soil structure and compromise long-term viability of soil treatment potential. Its use to unclog failed infiltration fields is no longer recommended.
- *Organic solvents*, often chlorinated hydrocarbons (e.g., methylene chloride, trichloroethylene) commonly used as degreasers and marketed for their ability to break down oils and grease. Organic solvents represent significant risks to ground water and wastewater treatment processes. These products can destroy resident populations of decomposer and other helpful microorganisms in the treatment system. Use of products containing organic solvents in onsite treatment systems is banned in many states. Introduction of organic solvents into onsite systems located in states that ban the use of these products may trigger liability issues if ground water becomes contaminated.
- *Biological additives*, like bacteria and extracellular enzymes mixed with surfactants or nutrient solutions, which mirror but do not appear to significantly enhance normal biological decomposition processes in the septic tank. Some biological additives have been found to degrade or dissipate septic tank scum and sludge. However, whether this relatively minor benefit is derived without compromising long-term viability of the soil infiltration system has not been demonstrated conclusively. Some studies suggest that material degraded by additives in the tank contributes to increased loadings of BOD, TSS, and other contaminants in the otherwise clarified septic tank effluent.
